

Terms and conditions “Swissness in Poland”

- 1 The organizers of the event are the Polish-Swiss Chamber of Commerce and Victorinox Poland.
2. The event will take place on September 10, 2025, at the headquarters of Victorinox Poland, located at 62 Komitetu Obrony Robotników Street, Warsaw.
3. Guests of the event may include representatives of member companies of the Polish-Swiss Chamber of Commerce as well as other individuals personally invited by the Organizers..
4. Participation in the event is free of charge for invited guests.
5. Participation requires registering for the event by sending an email to mj@swisschamber.pl The number of places is limited.
6. By registering for the event, you consent to the processing of your personal data included in the email by the event Organizers in accordance with applicable regulations, as well as to the use of your image captured during the event for the Organizers’ promotional purposes.

8. The personal data processed by the Administrators includes your first name, last name, position, company name, and email address.
9. The Administrators process your personal data for the purpose of:
 - the implementation of Swissness in Poland (hereinafter referred to as the “Event”), including registration for the Event and communication with Event participants as part of organizational activities preceding the Event – the legal basis for processing personal data is the consent of the data subject (Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR). The data subject has the right to withdraw their consent at any time. Withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out based on consent before its withdrawal,
 - establishing contact with Event participants – the legal basis for processing personal data is the necessity of processing for purposes arising from the legitimate interests pursued by the Administrator. The legitimate interest of the Administrator, in this case, is maintaining contact with Event participants (Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR),
 - maintaining statistics and reports, as well as archiving for the internal needs of the Administrator related to the number of Event participants – the legal basis for processing personal data is the necessity of processing for purposes arising from the legitimate interests pursued by the Administrator. The legitimate interest of the Administrator in this case is maintaining statistics and reports (Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR),
 - the potential establishment, pursuit, or defense against claims related to the organization of the Event – the legal basis for processing personal data is the necessity of processing for the purpose of pursuing the legitimate interests of the Administrator. The legitimate interest of the Administrator, in this case, is the ability to establish, pursue, or defend against claims (Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR).

10. You have the right to request access to your personal data, their rectification, deletion, restriction of processing, the right to data portability, and the right to object to their processing, including processing based on the legitimate interests of the Administrator. You also have the right to lodge a complaint if you believe that the processing of your data violates the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) of April 27, 2016. Complaints should be submitted to the supervisory authority, which is the President of the Personal Data Protection Office.

13. Personal data will be stored for a period of 30 days from the date of the Event's conclusion or until you submit a request for: deletion, withdrawal of consent to the processing of personal data, restriction of processing, objection to processing, or data portability; for the purpose of establishing, pursuing, or defending against claims – until the limitation period for claims expires in accordance with generally applicable Polish law; or until the legitimate interest of the Administrator is fulfilled.
