

Event Terms and Conditions - Business Mixer „Back to Business”

1. The event is organised by: the Polish-Swiss Chamber of Commerce, Advantage Austria, the Belgian Business Chamber, the British-Polish Chamber of Commerce, the Polish-Canadian Chamber of Commerce, the Irish-Polish Chamber of Commerce, the Polish-Italian Chamber of Commerce, the Polish-Luxembourg Chamber of Commerce, the Polish-Romanian Bilateral Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Polish-Spanish Chamber of Commerce and the Polish-Ukrainian Chamber of Commerce.

2. The event will take place on 16 September 2026 at the Warsaw School of Economics, 162 Aleja Niepodległości, Warsaw.

3. Guests at the event may include representatives of member companies of the Swiss Chamber and other guests invited by the organisers.

4. Attendance at the event is subject to a fee for invited guests.

Cost of attendance:

150 PLN + VAT for representatives of member companies

300 PLN + VAT for representatives of non-member companies

Due to the limited number of places, those who confirm their attendance but do not attend the event and do not cancel their registration by 10 September 2026 will be charged a fee of 150 PLN net (for members) or 300 PLN net (for non-members) to cover the costs of organising the event.

5. Registration for the meeting is required and can be completed by sending an email to kk@swisschamber.pl. Places are limited.

6. Registration for the event constitutes consent to the processing of personal data contained in the email by the event organisers in accordance with applicable regulations, as well as consent to the use of any image captured during the event for the organisers' promotional purposes.

8. The scope of your personal data processed by the Controller includes your first name, surname, job title, company name and email address.

9. The Controller processes your personal data for the following purposes:

- organising the 'Back to Business' Business Mixer (hereinafter referred to as the 'Event'), including registration for the Event and contacting Event participants as part of the organisational activities preceding the Event – the legal basis for the processing of personal data is the consent of the data subject (Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR). The data subject has the right to withdraw their consent at any time. Withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out on the basis of consent prior to its withdrawal.
- to contact participants of the Event – the legal basis for data processing is that processing is necessary for purposes arising from the legitimate interests pursued by the Controller. The Controller's legitimate interest in this case is to contact participants of the Event (Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR),

- compiling statistics and reports, and archiving data for the Controller's internal purposes relating to the number of Event participants – the legal basis for data processing is that processing is necessary for the purposes of the Controller's legitimate interests. The Controller's legitimate interest is to compile statistics and reports (Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR),
- to establish, pursue or defend against any claims relating to the organisation of the Event – the legal basis for data processing is that processing is necessary for the purposes of the Controller's legitimate interests. The Controller's legitimate interest in this case is the ability to establish, pursue or defend against claims (Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR).

10. You have the right to request access to your personal data, to have it rectified, erased or its processing restricted; you also have the right to data portability and the right to object to the processing of your personal data, including processing based on the controller's legitimate interests. You have the right to lodge a complaint if you consider that the processing of your data infringes the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation of 27 April 2016. The complaint should be lodged with the supervisory authority, which is the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection.

11. Personal data will be retained for a period of 30 days from the date of the Event's conclusion or until you submit a request: to have your data erased, to withdraw your consent to the processing of personal data, to restrict processing, to object to the processing of your data, or to have your data transferred, for the purpose of establishing, exercising or defending against legal claims – until the limitation period for claims expires in accordance with the generally applicable provisions of Polish law; until the Controller's legitimate interest has been fulfilled.
